**About CSP:** Founded in 1995, the Corryville Suzuki Project (CSP) is a nurturing, non-competitive string music education program where children receive a high level of musical training, rooted in Dr. Suzuki's philosophy that every child can learn. The CSP program espouses this core value of the Suzuki philosophy in a very literal way by inviting children of every economic, racial, and social background to communicate, develop high-level skills, and begin friendships through beautiful music.

**Camp Fee:** Tuition is \$180. Early registration (postmarked by May 15<sup>th</sup>) is \$160. After May 24<sup>th</sup>, registration will be accepted as space allows. The fee is non-refundable and includes all activities and materials. Campers are required to wear a purple CSP t-shirt for the concert. Include \$15 with registration if you do not own a shirt from last year's camp.

*Parents of campers ages 4-6 are required to attend repertoire and technique classes with their children. Parent attendance at other classes is optional.*

### CSP Artistic Directors:

*The CSP Artistic Directors have taught, performed, and lectured at summer Suzuki institutes and workshops for over 13 years. Vincent and Elizabeth founded the CSP Summer Camp to offer an affordable, quality educational opportunity for local students, with the assistance of other fine local teachers.*

**Dr. Vincent Phelan** is Concertmaster of the Middletown Symphony, and liturgical musician at the Community of the Good Shepherd Parish. He is an active recitalist, and has performed with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, Cincinnati Ballet Orchestra, Columbus Symphony, Dayton Philharmonic, and other musical organizations throughout Ohio. Vincent has performed extensively for young audiences, and also enjoys bluegrass fiddling. Vincent holds degrees from the Cleveland Institute of Music and the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music (CCM) where he studied with Won Bin Yim and Dorothy Delay. He has studied Suzuki Pedagogy with Linda Stieg, Nancy Lokken, Pat D'Ercole, and Ronda Cole. Vincent is currently Instructor of Strings and Chamber Music at Ursuline Academy, and Instructor of Violin at God's Bible School and College. Previously Vincent held teaching positions at Nagel Middle School and the CCM Preparatory Department.

**Elizabeth Council-Phelan** is Principal Violist of the Middletown Symphony. She has performed with the Cincinnati Ballet Orchestra, Columbus Symphony, Dayton Philharmonic, and the Richmond (Ind.) Symphony. As a college student, she performed with the All-American College Orchestra at Disney's Epcot Center. Elizabeth received her Bachelor of Music degree in Viola Performance from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. She holds a Master of Music degree from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music (CCM) where she was a scholarship student of Peter Kamnitzer. Elizabeth studied Suzuki pedagogy with Michelle George, Nancy Lokken, Joe McSpadden, Ronda Cole, and Carol Smith. Elizabeth has held former teaching positions in Kansas, and at the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp in Twin Lake, Michigan. Elizabeth has taught in Cincinnati at the Musical Arts Center, CCM Preparatory Department, and Guardian Angels Church music program.
